CALL TO ORDER:

The Monthly Business Meeting of the West Shore Regional Police Department Commission was held at 510 Herman Ave, Lemoyne, PA and called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Chairman Martini with the Commissioner Beasley leading the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Motion:

Commissioner Gallo made a motion to approve the Minutes of the May 12, 2021 Monthly Business Meeting that were previously distributed, seconded by Commissioner Rothman. The motion passed unanimously.

CITIZENS/VISITORS:

Lt. Friel along with Wormleysburg Borough resident Don Paul Shearer was present for the meeting.

Mr. Shearer addressed the Commission about Police Officers aggressive driving and becoming involved in pursuits of suspects. He praised our Officers for his view of the

past 3 or 4 weeks advising that that were driving slower along Front Street in Wormleysburg.

CHAIRMAN’S ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Chairman Martini discussed the traffic issues that were taking place on May 14th in the area of the Drive-Thru PA Greek Fest and thanked the Chief for sending Officers to assist in rectifying the issue. Within 15 minutes of their arrival the traffic problem was resolved. He also announced that there would be an Executive Session to discuss a Personnel issue.

TREASURER’S REPORT:

Commissioner Preble reported balances of \$761,531.88 in the checking account, \$10,547.84 in the donation checking account and \$13,354.97 in the K9 donation account as of May 31, 2021. Commissioner Preble also reported a balance of \$288,017.29 in the Capital Reserve Fund.

Commissioner Preble made a motion to approve the May 2021 Treasurer’s Report and to submit it for audit, seconded by Commissioner Gallo. The motion passed unanimously.
